Local crime

There has been a slight increase in incidents when comparing March, April and May 2010 with 2009. All crime is up by 14%, but that equates to only 6 incidents (41 in 2009 and 47 in 2010). Burglaries are up by 2 incidents, vehicle crime is up by only 4. Robbery is at zero and has remained so for the last 12 months. Anti-social behaviour (ASB) is still down by 23% and has steadily declined over the last 12 months.

8 cases were solved in this area. 2 formal warnings were given for cannabis possession. 2 males asked for offences to be taken into consideration in court - being burglary and theft from a vehicle. 1 male has been charged for assault and assault without injury. 1 fixed penalty notice (FPN) issued to a female for drunk and disorderly and a restorative resolution used for another female for assault.

ASB

In an effort to keep the levels of ASB low, work still continues on the provision of a multi-use games area (MUGA) and 2 youth shelters. One is to be located on the path from Piccadilly Mews to Cricketers Row, one beside the MUGA - MUGA and shelter to be located in the Winslow Youth Centre. Winslow Town Council is in the process of consulting with the young people on its design and provision. All legal aspects are being working through as well.

Youth Café - we have a new team leader, David Podmore of Winslow Vineyard. Please contact David if you would like to volunteer to help run it or have ideas for a venue.

Rogue Traders

Several reports have been received about a company claiming to be working for AVDC regarding new boilers or loft insulation. They DO NOT work on their behalf: they want bank or security details so do not give such info out to unknown or unsolicited callers.

Speeding

Safer Roads and Neighbourhood policing teams carried out enforcement in Swanbourne and Buckingham Road, Winslow. 18 vehicles stopped in Swanbourne (1 above 50mph), several for seat belt offences including a van where the passenger only had a box to sit on! In Winslow 15 FPNs were issued for excessive speed, 2 for seat belt offences and 1 for number plate offences.

Many thanks to Swanbourne House School for the use of their drive for talking to all offenders.

Thames Valley Police (TVP) has a pool of volunteers who are willing to help villages with the use of the Speedwatch system. Please let us know if you need their support.

If your village would like a system and do not have the funds to buy one, please let TVP or Phil Gomm know. There are several villages who would like to form groups enabling costs to be shared.

Countryside Crime/Dogwatch

Countrywatch has been relaunched with a new logo and more benefits. TVP is trialling text messaging in Berks so farmers and landowners will be informed more quickly about crime in their areas. This will be rolled when any technical problems have been ironed out. TVP has also launched Cesar which was originally devised for plant theft. When insurance stats were looked at it was found a huge amount of farming equipment and plant is also stolen so TVP has extended the facility to the rural community. Please contact your neighbourhood team for details of this scheme and get on board now - the first 900 applicants' costs will be reduced by 20%. Insurance companies are also reducing premiums to those with Cesar marking by approx 12% so there a real saving.
