#### **Scheduled Service Update**

We are now running our Wednesday Winslow Market Service and our Friday & Saturday Aylesbury Market Service.

Due to government restrictions, and the need to keep yourselves and our drivers safe, we have put in

place strict guidelines for our drivers and passengers.

To comply with current 1 metre + social distancing, we have removed some seats as we are only able to

transport 6 passengers at any one time. It will also be impossible to use the tail lift while maintaining a

socially safe distance, so you will need to be able to board the bus unaided using the main door.

I've been a keen cyclist for over 50 years, and I was lucky to be introduced to the joys of the bike as a child. Nowadays, family cycling is just as much fun and as a bonus we live in one of the best places in the country for two-wheeled adventures. So I thought you might appreciate a few routes for safe (and not too strenuous) family rides from North Marston. Each ride is between 8 and 10 miles long, and there is a refreshment yenue on each ride too!

If it's dry and bright, why not dust of your bikes and get some healthy exercise in the fresh air?

1. The Claydon Loop via Granborough: (9 miles, with four gentle climbs), refreshments at The Pilgrim on returning

#### Saturday 19th June 10.30am Furzton LAKE, MILTON KEYNES

From A421 (H8) to Milton Keynes, turn left on to V4 Watling Street. After signposted road on left for Furzton, turn left into unmarked car park just before concrete footbridge GR851358. Walking on hard paths around the lake. Lovely scenery and wildlife. 3.5 miles

#### Wednesday 23rd June 10.30 am Thornborough

Park and meet by green pub GR745336

Walking past pond in Main St to go up Back Street, cross ford taking footpath on right up track across pasture meeting road at Crossbridge Cottages. After half a mile take footpath on right. Following along field edges and spinney behind Crossbridge Farm continuing down to Thornborough over stiles and footbridge. 3.5 miles

#### Saturday 26th June 10.30am Silverstone

Take A413 through Whittlebury turning left to Silverstone. Park in roads around St Michaels Church GR667442. Exploring points of interest in the village then walking to Hucknell Woods following footpaths and bridleway. May be muddy in wood. 1 stile. Dogs on leads 4.5 miles

## The Cutting Garden in June

With the coldest, driest spring it's been such a challenge for the garden to get going. Hopefully by now with the warmth and definitely moisture we are expecting a blooming June!

#### A few jobs for June

- -Thin out hardy annuals to 30cm spacing to allow more roots, leaves and flowers and a longer life eg nigella, cornflowers, marigolds. Be brutal to get good healthy plants
- Pick sweet peas as soon as they start to flower to encourage more blooms. Give them a weekly feed.
- Dead head roses if they are the repeat flowering type.
- Stake tall or floppy perennials to prevent wind rock (I am writing this on a very windy day here in May!)
- Direct sow poppies now as many varieties flower in 8 wks.
- Deadheading flowers as they go over this month eg hardy and half hardy annuals can result in a second flowering.
- Cut back delphiniums right to the ground and most plants will give you a second flush in August and September.
- Stake and tie in dahlias as they grow
- Harden off hanging baskets and containers growing in the greenhouse and move to final outdoor position.
- Wait for bulb foliage to die down naturally before cutting back. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of bulbs.
- Sow next spring's biennials, such as wallflowers & honesty, as need time to establish. Direct sow or short on space in pots and plant out in the autumn.

#### Thought for the month

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues[a] as the Spirit enabled them. The Book of Acts, Chapter 2, verses 1-4

How appropriate that our first gathering back in Church should have been on Pentecost Sunday, 23rd May. It has been so long since we have all been "together in one place". The past year has been extremely traumatic for all of us and we have all missed deeply, the sense of community which in kinder times we simply took for granted.

There has been much to be proud of in the past year. Our Zoom services and the numerous acts of neighbourly kindness, especially those directed at the clinically vulnerable, have been a wonderful expression of true Christian community and while we have not all been "together in one place", we have been, in another way, in words used a couple of chapters later in the book of Acts "of one heart and mind".

It will take time for all of us to get used to being physically present to one another again. Some will take longer than others to emerge fully from the hibernation of lock-down and of course we remain for now with the strangeness of social distancing, risk assessments, masking and, for now, very limited music as we are not yet allowed to sing together.

Our Pentecost is not marked by the sudden changes which marked the day of Pentecost as told by St Luke in the Book of Acts, but this is nonetheless a season of new beginnings and fresh blessings, thanks be to God!



# North Marston woman charged with being topless on London

#### New York Times, August 1964

LONDON, Aug. 21—The first topless dress prosecution in Britain was completed today amid roars of laughter in a Bow Street court. Mrs. Diana Gorton, a 30-year old housewife who posed for photographers in a black topless dress on Westminster Bridge, was found guilty of indecency. But she was given a conditional release. The star of the court performance was not the defendant, however, but Leonard Winter, an elderly street photographer who objected to the intrusion of his territory. There was laughter as Mr. Winter began to describe the day "a woman who appeared to have no top to her dress" posed on his "pitch" near a bridge statue. He said he went up to the woman in the topless and said, "You ought to be pinched." "You mean arrested?" the prosecuting attorney asked. "Yes," Mr. Winter replied. "What did you feel about all this?" Mr. Winter was asked. "It was annoying people," he replied. "I was standing there to get my living and people were complaining about the obstruction." When the laughter subsided, Mr. Winter was asked whether he had seen anything like this before, "I have a wife," he said. "That is at home," the prosecutor said, "but this was Westminster Bridge on a Friday afternoon. Did it have any effect on you personally?" "No," replied Mr. Winter, "I am 70 years of age." Then Mrs. Gorton, modestly attired in sweater and skirt, cross examined the street photographer. "Were you personally annoyed?" she asked. "Yes," Mr. Winter replied amid a roar of laughter. "Why should you come on my pitch? I am licensed there."

(Diana Gorton lived in Mill House, North Marston).

#### **Granborough Village Hall Needs You**

Granborough village hall is a registered charity run by a group of Trustees who are responsible for maintaining the hall and grounds. The hall is for everyone to use and is hired regularly by many age groups for meetings, classes, parties and other events. The Church use it as a hall and the Parish Council meets there. We should have a minimum of eleven Trustees who include the Vicar, the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Parish Council. We would welcome more residents to join us. We are approaching exciting times as we plan to re-open a fully restored hall in Summer 2021 with a new calendar of exciting events.

We meet between 6 and 8 times a year and organise several social events during the year. We also support other village events such as the Charter Fayre.

#### **Grass cutting on the Sports Field**

At this time of year we begin cutting the outfield and open spaces on the Sports Field. This is done weekly during April, May, June & July. After this the grass growth usually slows down and the frequency of cuts is generally not as regular.

With up to 25 grass cuts during the season (April – September) we try to get as many people as possible to volunteer for one of these cuts. It spreads the load. To cut the whole field takes around 3 hours so it's not unduly time consuming and on a warm summer's day/ evening it can indeed be an enjoyable way to spend a few hours.

We have a ride-on mower which is easy to use and all new volunteers will be given a short demo on how to operate the mowing machine. This can be done beforehand, usually on one evening with a group of others new volunteers.

If you use the Sports Field in any capacity, I'm sure you will appreciate how much effort and goodwill goes into the upkeep. If you would like to contribute to its upkeep this is one way that you can help us. We always find it difficult to fill our mowing rota and often 3 or 4 of the stalwarts end up having to do 2, 3 or 4 grass cuts to fill in the weeks where we are short of volunteers.

We operate a rota for the mowing and this is filled on a weekly basis as volunteers respond. There are 25 weeks to choose from. Some have already been filled but we have many more weeks still to fill.

# Public Rights of Way (PRoW): Footpaths and Bridleways: Responsibilities for Maintenance

The Parish Council is not responsible for maintaining footpaths, responsibilities are divided between landowners and Buckinghamshire Council (BC). This is a quick guide, detailed information is at <a href="https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/environment/public-rights-way/">https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/environment/public-rights-way/</a>

Trees and hedges: it is the landowner's responsibility to maintain hedges and trees adjacent to PRoWs. BC has powers to require owners to remove overgrowth (Highway Act 1980 section 154). Undergrowth: BC are responsible for clearing any vegetation naturally growing on the surface of a path, and respond to requests for clearance as required.

There is nothing to prevent walkers from clearing PRoWs and Ramblers Association Path Clearing Groups do so in some areas. Leave the landowners vegetation: it is their property.

Autumn cultivation and PRoWs: Legally, a farmer may plough a PRoW only if it is not convenient to avoid disturbing the path, but must reinstate it within 14 days of first disturbance, and the path must be levelled and made visible, and within 24 hours of any subsequent disturbance. Reinstatement must be: at least 1 metre for a cross-field footpath, across the cultivation; 2 metres for a crossfield bridleway across the cultivations.

Report an issue on a public footpath, bridleway or byway online. https://prow.buckscc.gov.uk/standardmap.aspx

Eg: broken stiles; overgrown vegetation or fallen trees; damaged or dangerous path surfaces; damaged or dangerous bridges; damaged or missing signposts and waymarks.

Or, The Ramblers Association: Report path problems through Pathwatch and they will alert the local highway authority. <a href="https://www.ramblers.org.uk/advice/pathwatch-report-path-features-and-problems.aspx">https://www.ramblers.org.uk/advice/pathwatch-report-path-features-and-problems.aspx</a>

The Ramblers have their Pathwatch App you can download and then report problems on your walk as you come across them.

# Draft Minutes of the North Marston Parish Council Meeting held at the Village Hall 11th May 2021 at 8.00pm

- Parish Council Elections: Ian Mordue was elected as Chairman, no Vice Chairperson was nominated. All councillors received the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and Register of Interests. Andrew Boyt and Jon Martin were co-opted as councillors
- 2. Minutes: Approved minutes of the meeting dated 13th April 2021
- 3. Working Parties; The following councillors were appointed Neighbourhood Plan – Cllr Du Plessis Sportsfield Committee – Cllr Mordue & Cllr Martin North Marston Community Speed Watch – Cllr Martin Poors Piece & Clocklands – Cllr Martin & Cllr Symonds Playground Project completion– Cllr Du Plessis Playground upkeep & maintenance – Cllr Du Plessis & Cllr Newman & Cllr Martin Wildlife Group – Cllr Hogbin-Mills (Trevor Jenkins heads up this
- group)
  4. **Outside Bodies**; The following representatives were elected:

Village Hall Trustees (must be Chairman) – Cllr Mordue Village Hall Committee (to be reinstated) – Cllr Mordue Community Board - Cllr Boyt North Bucks Parishes Planning Consortium – Rota Parish Liaison Meeting – Rota

- 5. **The council documents for 2021/2022** will be uploaded onto the website
- 6. Buckinghamshire Council

3 new Councillors have been elected as unitary councillors for the Great Brickhill Ward, of which North Marston Parish is a part. Phil Gomm will act in this capacity for North Marston.

Cllr Gomm provided the following update: The Unitary has now started and are tasked how to address the Covid Recovery. HS2/East West Rail - 60m has been obtained to help local communities blighted along the HS2 route. Roads - 90m over the next 4 years has been allocated. Why the roads are not surviving our weather is being looked into. Schools - 90% of schools in the country are good/outstanding by Ofsted. New Police Commissioner is Matthew Barber. 260 officers are allocated to Thames Valley. Speeding and rural crime are some of the main priorities. Planning - There is a shortage of planning officers which is being addressed and PCs can request an application be "called in" via their Unitary Councillor to be placed in front of a committee for decision.

- 7. Planning Application: Objection: 21/01380/ACL Three Corners Piece Granborough Road. Based on a previous objection10/00307/ App, the application is not in line with the draft neighbourhood plan, it is outside of the proposed settlement boundary of the development plan.
- **8. Neighbourhood Plan:** The Chairman confirmed the final draft will be agreed on the 3<sup>rd</sup> June. The plan will be discussed with the PC during June before the definitive plan is made.
- **9. Village Upkeep:** The planting of a cherry tree outside 10 Granborough Road, inline with the other trees, was approved

#### 10. Parish Action Plan/Projects:

Playground - Cllr Du Plessis confirmed the levelling and seeding has been completed. The fencing, paving and the gate – date tbc. A grass cutting regime will be produced, the basketball backing will be replaced and the football posts painted. Cllr Mordue confirmed that following an investigation with the installation company, manufacturer and ROSPA, the swing basket met the manufacturers standards and ROSPA safety standards. The swing basket has been reinstated at a higher level to provide a higher ground clearance, making it even safer with the correct usage. Playground opening – Confirmed the opening of the playground on the 4th September 12.00-15.00 in line with a Church Event. Cllr Gomm to ask Greg Smith to open the playground. The school and parishioners to be asked to come forward with a name for the playground. Playground toilet facilities – it was agreed, that in line with other village playgrounds, there would not be any toilet facilities made available at the request of the shop.

**Traffic Calming** – Cllr Gomm confirmed that an intervillage group would be set up to tackle such solutions.

**Great British Spring Clean** – Confirmed the date as 5<sup>th</sup> June 9.30-11.30. Agreed a budget of £150 to be allocated to cover cost of litter pickers/hiviz and gloves. These will be used by the village and the school. **Church Committee Request** – Confirmed in principle the planting bulbs of different colours on the green in front of the Red House in the shape of a crown for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, is a nice idea, but in practise the area will still need to be mowed. The Church committee to be asked to propose a plan to address this.

**Pond** – Agreed Cllr Mordue will be in charge, with Trevor Jenkins, to decide on the water source to fill the pond. As minuted in December 2020 well water will be used if the nitrate and phosphate levels are within the acceptable limits and if not then Anglian Water will be used. Trevor Jenkins to be asked to provide a pond plan update.

Village Hall Rentals – Agreed that apart from Pre School and guitar lessons, the VH will not open up to rentals until step 4 of the Covid Plan. Land opposite 29 Quainton Road – Agreed the PC boundary needs to be re-established asap. Cllr Martin & Cllr Mordue to cut back and reinstate by the June Meeting. £100 budget was allocated for equipment/materials.

**Magazine** – Confirmed there had been 204 visitors to the website and 48 magazine hits. Agreed that an email list of parishioners that would like to receive the magazine will be created by Cllr Mordue in line with GDPR.

#### **Next Parish Council meeting:**

There will be no Annual Village meeting on the 18th May. All reports will be available on the website.

#### North Marston Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has only been able to hold monthly "Zoom" meetings during the past 12 months, and, while we have made significant progress since lockdown began, this has necessarily been at a much slower pace than we had contemplated a year ago.

In particular, our inability to carry out any form of group outside research has hampered our progress greatly until very recently, and we have, of course, been unable to hold many face-to-face discussions with residents and stakeholders. This has resulted in the whole Neighbourhood Plan process taking much longer than either the Parish Council or the Steering Group would have wished, and we apologise for any frustrations the delays may have caused.

However, the Steering Group has now completed all our fact finding and evidence-gathering, and we have produced sets of agreed objectives and draft policies in the four general areas covered by the Plan:

- History and Heritage
- Green Environment
- Community and Sustainability
- Built Environment (including Traffic and Transport)

We are currently in the process of developing versions of the Neighbourhood Plan itself, and we intend to have an agreed preliminary draft version of the text ready for discussion and comment by the Parish Council within the next month. After these discussions we will move on to producing the text of the final Draft Plan, for the Parish Council's endorsement and acceptance.

The Group has also started work on devising a North Marston Design Code which will eventually be our recommended blueprint for the design and form of any new building in the parish. This project was started following Guidelines for Planning issued last year by central government which are aimed at giving communities a louder voice in the appearance of their surroundings. The Design Code will be published at the same time as the Neighbourhood Plan and will be a

formal annex to the Plan. Its contents will be referenced in relevant Plan Policies.

When both the Draft Neighbourhood Plan and the Design Code have been finalised, a period of consultation with the parish community and other interested parties can begin. This lasts for a period of 6 weeks or more, and the Steering Group is planning to hold Open Parish Exhibitions during the consultation period to display and discuss the Plan with all residents and stakeholders, and, importantly, to receive representations about the Plan's contents. The Group must consider these representations, and, if appropriate, make amendments as a result of them. We intend that the Draft Plan will be available in both hard and soft copy versions throughout the consultation period.


Following this consultation and any necessary amendments, a finished Neighbourhood Plan can be prepared ready for submission to statutory outside bodies for examination prior to the formal parish referendum.

This programme is, of course, dependent upon the continued increased freedom from restrictions and, especially, that larger public meetings will be able to take place safely in the Village Hall later this year.


