



### Carbon Literacy Training for the Local Community

This 'Carbon Literacy Project' accredited course is aimed at local community residents.

About this event:

Climate change, zero carbon and global warming. What does it all mean and how does it affect me? What can I do to start my journey to low carbon living?

This course will give you the knowledge and tools to help reduce your and your community's carbon footprint.

No previous knowledge is needed.

Carbon Literacy is: "An awareness of the carbon dioxide costs and impacts of everyday activities, and the ability and motivation to reduce emissions, on an individual, community and organisational basis."

Over 20,000 citizens and 57 organisations have already been certified Carbon Literate so far, with over 1,760 organisations being engaged.

By the end of the course, you will:

- Understand and explain the science around climate change and how it affects us globally and locally
- Have the tools and knowledge to reduce your carbon impact and that of your local community.
- Build your own climate pledges to take action on climate change

You will also be able to:

- Build a network of like-minded people
- · Start collaborations

Training will be delivered online via Zoom through 3 X 2 hour sessions, and some homework. It will consist of a mixture of presentations, group activities, videos, quizzes and games.

Please ensure you have a WiFi/internet connection and adequate equipment that enables you to fully participate in the training (it is not recommended to do the course via iPhone/Smartphone). You will get the best out of the training if you use a laptop or PC (with a camera).

There is a £10 administration fee payable in advance which will enable you to apply for Carbon Literacy certification. Your certificate will be awarded after you have submitted an assessment form to the Carbon Literacy Project you will need to submit an assessment form at the end of the course with a £10 administration fee, which will be checked by the Carbon Literacy Project.

### **North Marston Community Shop Association Ltd**

### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR ELEVENTH AGM HELD ON 29™ SEPTEMBER 2021

### **GENERAL**

The Shop has experienced many setbacks during the year. These were mainly due to the effects of Covid regulations which deterred many volunteers and shoppers. The Shop Committee made safety regulations to protect staff and customers from catching or passing-on Covid. The Manager, plus a number of resolute volunteers valiantly managed to keep The Shop open, although on a reduction of opening hours. They deserve high praise for their kindness in taking action to help the business to continue serving the North Marston community and communities around despite the very difficult circumstances and, at that time, unknown details of Covid transfer in, and outdoors.

### FINANCIAL SITUATION

During Covid lockdowns The Shop came under financial difficulties due to less footfall and many people taking advantage of supermarkets' home deliveries. A grant of £1500 was applied for from Bucks County Council .A second grant of £5000 from The Heart of Bucks bought £500 worth of Covid protective equipment and also helped to keep The Shop from failing. We are very grateful for this emergency support.

### STOCK AND SUPPLIES

There have been difficulties with accessing stock due to a shortage of lorry drivers. I wrote to our MP, Greg Smith, about this and he passed it on to Baroness Wallersteiner. However, I don't think that MPs appreciate how difficult things have been for small food businesses. The Shop Manager and some volunteer drivers kindly took action by visiting Bookers to collect stock to keep the shop supplied. This is an ongoing necessity.

A number of small suppliers of local food have retired so the shop is looking for new ones to provide locally made products which, besides being delicious, and made of natural ingredients, (without unnecessary additives) help to cut down on carbon emissions and climate change. The Shop is currently looking for jam, marmalade and chutney makers.

Delicious, frozen beef from a local farmer is now stocked in The Shop. The farmer raises his stock on grass only and does not feed soya—based feeds because they affect climate change due to forestry destruction. Some individual customers think the packs are currently too large for them but in future there will be a mix of large and small sized packs. Prices are similar to supermarket ones.

With climate change a huge item on the world agenda The Shop aims to reduce its carbon footprint by stocking as much local produce as possible, (thus cutting down on carbon emissions) cutting down on waste and ordering larger amounts of fresh and longer life items from its suppliers. This, does, of course, depend on the amount of stock sold.

The Shop is still aiming to reduce climate change by sourcing more reusable bags and containers and has successfully found some this year but is still looking for re-usable or compostable carrier bags.

### **RE-OPENING**

The Shop re-opened to customers entering the premises after adding a protective screen to the counter, providing hand gel and asking shoppers to wear masks inside the shop. Sadly the shop cannot open for all the hours it originally did until more volunteers are available. Lack of extended opening hours at the shop, and home deliveries by the large supermarkets, have contributed to a loss of footfall and profit. If this were to continue the worst scenario would be that The Shop would maybe be unable to continue trading. This would be a total disaster for the village particularly in adverse winter weather such as heavy snow or floods.

### Other difficulties included:

- One of the freezers needed to be replaced
- Replacing the mains water distributor in The Shop.
- Loss of business due to road closures and diversions.

### LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

To continue to be a successful social enterprise and business, despite having suffered loss of business as described above, the Shop Committee is looking into reviving the plans for an extension to provide extra stock space, especially for fruit, vegetables and salad items and a seating area inside, plus a verandah to enable customers to sit overlooking the park while consuming hot or cold drinks or ice-creams. As well as seeking grants for an extension The Committee is seeking additional funding for solar panels to reduce the cost of electricity and hopefully to receive some payments for surplus generation. Our MP, Greg Smith, supports this venture.

### **STAFF**

Many thanks to the Manager, Eddie Parsley, for keeping the shop stocked and operational in these difficult times. We hope he will get some extra volunteers to assist in keeping the shop open for longer hours during the day. Opening hours from 07.00 to 17.00 would help everyone, particularly school children, school staff, workmen and parents.

The Shop has been very lucky to have some reliable, kind and capable part-time Managers: Lou Addison, Sheila Squire, Kathryn Hanson and Matilda Phillips who looked after The Shop with some super volunteers, while the Manager, Eddie Parsley, was away on holiday. Thank you all for your help and kindness which has been much appreciated by everyone. You ALL make our community shop very special.

Leaflets have gone out to the whole village asking for volunteers but so far no responses have been received. This is very sad as it also prevents the shop from supporting young volunteers and Duke of Edinburgh's award students and the youngsters from Furzedown School who came to do work experience at the shop. If everyone thought about which hour they could cover in the shop on a weekly basis the shop would be able to open from 07.00 to 17.00 or 18.00 thus allowing youngsters to partake in voluntary sessions as described above.

### MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee has reduced from the requisite eight members, to five, during the current year. A letter went out to residents asking for new members but so far we have received just one application.

It is thirteen and a half years since I first invited all residents to fill in a questionnaire about the provision of a community shop in the village. I received an 89.9% response rate, which was wonderful, and 12 requests to join the first committee!

I feel that it is time for me to retire and for younger residents to take up the places on the Management Committee and do great things to take the shop forward to more successes.

Thank you to everyone who has supported or helped the shop in any way over the last ten years. You have made my dream come true of a shop that cares for each and every customer and member of staff whether from our village and surrounding villages or those just passing through.

I wish the next committee Good Luck and success with the new challenges.

I have recently had a wonderful 2 weeks camping in The Lake District. Unusually for me, I managed to do a lot of reading including 2 novels by John Grisham. However, looking at stories on the net, I came across this one.

Terry Selwood was fishing off the coast of Australia, just like he had hundreds of times before. Something almost knocked him down and when he turned to see what it was that hit the boat, he realized that a seven foot, 440-pound Great White shark had jumped into his boat. After radioing for help, he jumped overboard and hung onto the side of the boat until he was rescued. He evidently did not think it wise to share his boat with a shark.

It's stories like this that make you think. You never know when life will take an unexpected turn for the worse. It could be a natural disaster that destroys property, an unforeseen layoff at work, or bad news from the Doctor. It can be something evil done to someone, or evil done by someone. It is a hard world, and bad things happen.

Extract from "Memories Shared" Volume 1: by Ivy Wheeler, born 1910

Pub. by North Marston History Club

"I lived in the centre cottage at 3, Church Street as a child and we paid rent of 2/6d per week to Henry Anstiss who lived at The Armed Yeoman. He didn't like us children sitting on the wall outside our cottage. He had a brother, Ted, who cut hair in an old caravan down the bottom of the High Street. I loved the 'Eton crop' hairstyle Ted Anstiss used to give me when I was about 14 years old.

We only had an outside toilet up the garden and we got our water from the pump outside Abbott's Cottage. I remember Alice Ward trudging up from the bottom of Quainton Road to get her water every day, carrying two buckets on a yoke. She wore old men's shoes and a long coat. When it was a new moon, Ted Tattam had to go round with a scoop and empty the toilets and put all the stuff in a pit.

My dad was a tailor but he suffered ill health and died from consumption in 1930. He came from Botolph Claydon and Sir Harry Verney paid for him to do an apprenticeship with Holden`s the tailor`s shop He was very young when he first went there and they half-starved him. They only gave him bread with grease on it. He ran home back to Claydon but his mother sent him straight back again.

My mother went to work every morning at 6am to Dominion Dairies in Buckingham Road in Aylesbury. She cycled there and back, and, at night, she`d come back with some wooden crates strapped to her cycle which she`d give to my Uncle Bernard Carter to chop up for kindling wood to sell round the village. As children we played with hoops, tops and whips in the road (there weren`t any cars about)."

### North Marston Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Neighbourhood Plan is now very close to completion, and we currently expect to be in a position to publish the Plan and all associated documents in November.

We are still awaiting formal responses from Buckinghamshire Council and other outside statutory bodies, but the draft Plan has been forwarded to the Parish Council prior to endorsement, and – subject to no surprise last-minute requirements for major amendment in the Plan! – the Steering Group will be able to complete our work on all the background documents during October.

After the Plan has been placed in the public domain, a "pre-submission consultation" period of at least 6 weeks will begin during which all parishioners and other interested parties can become involved by commenting on the published Plan before a finished Plan is sent to an Inspector for independent assessment.

The Steering Group intends to hold two Open House meetings during the consultation period at which anyone attending will be able to discuss the Plan personally with us. Representations will be accepted at these meetings, and online representations will also be possible.

We will welcome comments from all residents to try and ensure that the Plan does represent the views of North Marston as fairly as possible.

Look out for more details about the Plan's publication, the consultation process, and the Open House meetings in the Magazine and on noticeboards during the next 2 or 3 months.

The Neighbourhood Plan will be circulated and published online together with associated documents such as the Design Code. Library copies will also be lodged at facilities throughout the village.


