

Message from Rev Petra Elsmore

The idea of God puts many people off God. The idea of one who is above and beyond all things and yet who is involved in the daily lives of mortal humanity is just too much for many and can be a stumbling block to belief. The idea of one who is both powerful and good and yet who leaves the world to go its way as millions suffer and struggle is, for many good, thinking people, a clinching argument against the existence of God.

Perhaps the best answer to these questions is to be found in that most familiar of childhood memories, the Nativity scene.

Nativity scenes, tableaux, plays and the like have been with us since St Francis staged the first "Living Nativity" near Assisi. The society of Francis's day emphasised the prestige and power of kings and rulers and the religion of the day showed God in that light too... there was an emphasis on the glory and splendour of God, which mirrored the glory and splendour of a medieval court. Francis knew that this didn't help anyone feel closer to God and so he chose a cave in which to stage a recreation of the Bethlehem stable.

The heart of the Christmas message is that God is closer than you think. The Christmas story shows us God born into a human family. Frail, vulnerable and in need of human love and nurture.

In the words of Anthony de Mello: "We forget all too easily that one of the big lessons of the Incarnation is that God is found in the ordinary. You wish to see God? Look at the face of the person next to you. You want to hear God? Listen to the cry of a baby, the loud laughter at a party, the wind rustling in the trees. You want to feel God? Stretch your hand out and hold someone. Or just quiet yourself, become aware of the sensations in your body, sense God's almighty power at work in you and feel how near God is to you. Emmanuel, God-with-us."

Winslow & District Community Bus Needs Volunteer Drivers

The Winslow & District Community Bus relies on volunteer drivers to run its services, excursions and hires.

We are always in need of volunteer drivers, especially at the moment! So, if you have a D1 on your licence, and have some spare time, please consider becoming a driver for your local Community Bus.

You can do as much or as little as you like, from our shorter local runs to some of our longer day trips. We visit all kinds of places, including garden centres, stately homes, shopping centres, countryside drives as well as our regular scheduled bus services, and the people who use the bus are a very friendly crowd!

We offer certificated training to MIDAS standard, and pay out-of-pocket expenses.

Please call or visit our website for more information.

We are now running the following services:

<u>Aylesbury Market Bus</u> - runs every Friday and Saturday morning — from Winslow, through Gt Horwood, Little Horwood, Mursley and Swanbourne, arriving in Aylesbury just after 10am and departing at 12.15pm. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return.

Winslow Market Service 54abc - runs every Wednesday morning

This service picks up in the surrounding villages and then into Winslow, (Swanbourne, Mursley, Great Horwood, Whaddon, Nash and The Claydons). Pick up times vary according to village. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £3 00 return.

Buckingham Bus Service - runs on the first Tuesday of the month

Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. 1 hour in town then 1 hour in Tesco, or 2 hours in Tesco. Door to door service. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return.

Westcroft Shopping – runs every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month

Picking up in surrounding villages. Morrisons, Boots, Aldi, etc., bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return. Ring to book.

Despite the government lifting restrictions, we still have the following guidelines in place to help keep yourselves and our drivers safe:

- Please call and reserve your seat in advance. All 16 seats are back on board but the double seats are still for single occupancy only unless agreed in advance with the coordinator.
- . We ask that all passengers wear a face covering while travelling on the bus.
- We also ask that all passengers use the hand sanitiser provided on the bus.

Please contact the WDCB Coordinator for more details.

Passengers are not to travel on the bus if they or any member of their household are displaying any signs of the COVID-19 virus.

Village Cricket by Robin Harwood, extracted from "Memories Shared", Volume 1, published by North Marston History Club.

"I can remember several cricket grounds. One was behind the Wheatsheaf in Anders Oak; Laurence Young, the builder in the village, started the cricket off there. He was our umpire and it was mainly thanks to him that pitches were prepared and kit taken care of. Then Albert Franklin rented the field which is the site of the current sports ground and we played there for a time but he ploughed it up in the Second World war and we moved to his field along Portway (where Keith Franklin's house is now). Then we finally moved back to the original site down Granborough Road where it is now.

There was no League cricket until after World War 2, just friendlies. The local village games were always needle matches and none more so than those against Granborough. Everyone wanted to play in these and one evening we arrived for an away game and were just about to start when the farmer who owned the field rushed across and stopped the game because he hadn't been picked to play.

In another game against Mursley, the opposing wicket-keeper stood with his foot near the wickets and, as the ball passed, he tapped them with his foot, the bails fell off and the batsman was given out. In the pub afterwards he laughed with the batsman and admitted what he`d done.

The umpiring was a bit suspect sometimes – it wasn't unusual to hear from a bowler whose father was umpire, "How's that, dad?" and the answer would come back, "Out! Well bowled, son!"

The team I played in from the late 1940s through to the early 1950s won the Buckingham and District Cricket League six times, which was quite an achievement! In my best match I scored ninety out of the one hundred and twenty runs. I was voted Best Batsman and Best Bowler one year. We played in two leagues and some of our medals were inlaid with real gold and silver. Ray Young was a good batsman – he could really cut the ball. There were two other Harwoods in the team too – Eric and Chib.

After bringing home the League Cup the celebrations went on and on. The cup was filled up time and again in The Bell all through the evening for drinkers and non-drinkers alike. One man was so drunk that, as he lay on the green, they thought he was dead! A search for another man the next day found him asleep on top of the coal in his shed."

North Marston Neighbourhood Plan Update

The draft North Marston Neighbourhood Plan and all associated documents will be published online and be available to download on Wednesday December 15, following its formal endorsement by the Parish Council at their next meeting.

Full details of how to access the Plan will be contained in a leaflet that the Steering Group will circulate to all households around the date of publication, and the information will also appear on village noticeboards.

In addition, statutory consultees and other interested parties will receive the details via email, and library copies will be available to view at selected village amenities.

Publication of the Plan will start the process of "pre-submission consultation", during which everyone is free to make representations and comments about the Plan's contents and policies. These representations can lead to revision of the Plan to reflect consultation responses, and information about how to make representations will be published with the Plan.

The consultation process will extend for a period of 8 weeks from Wednesday December 15, 2021, to Wednesday February 9, 2022.

To encourage maximum engagement with the Plan, the Steering Group intends to host two drop-in sessions during January and February when anyone attending can discuss the Plan personally with us and make representations at the same time. Dates and times will be confirmed later, but we expect to hold one Saturday morning and one weekday evening session.

The Neighbourhood Plan is important to the village because it eventually becomes part of the legal framework within which decisions about North Marston will be made by local and national authorities. The more engagement there is with the consultation process the more the Steering Group can be confident that the final Plan truly reflects the views of the community. Please make sure your voice is heard.

Class 3 Roman Day Trip

Draft Minutes of the North Marston Parish Council Meeting at the Village Hall-Tuesday 9th November 2021 at 8.00pm

Cllr Gomm chaired the meeting as an independent party for planning applications 21/04108/ALB 47 Portway and 21/04041/PIP 49 Portway. In the Open Forum parishioners had 15 minutes for agenda items excluding 47 & 49 Portway applications, followed by 15 minutes where parishioners could voice their questions regarding 47 & 49 Portway. Ian Mordue had the opportunity to speak for 3 minutes on each of the applications. Ian Mordue was absent from the room whilst the discussion and vote took place between councillors on both applications.

3. Buckinghamshire Council

- 1. Drainage clearance still ongoing and in North Marston this is nearly complete and broken grates mended with a few exceptions
- 2. Highways closures are carefully being monitored to help residents
- 3. BCC looking to replace the water drains in the future to prevent road issues

4. Winslow and Villages Community board are allocating grants for various activities various activities towards phase 2 of the Big Bucks Tidy Up. North Marston has requested BCC to help with litter picking as the activity to help the community. A team from the village has already started to form.

4. Neighbourhood Plan:

The Neighbourhood Plan enforcement has been delayed. Amendments to the plan will be made and a final report circulated to councillors. Formal endorsement will take place at the December PC meeting on the 14th December. In the interim all other documents to support the plan can be finalised without endorsement. Consultation will be from 15th December and run for 8 weeks. This will be online, in community spaces and 2 open houses in January and February 2022. There has still not been a formal announcement from BCC.

The NP Steering group would like to thank Trevor Jenkins for his invaluable contribution to the Neighbourhood Plan and wish him well with his move

Acknowledged the Design Code grant, NPG 12442 from Groundworks, for £4,730 has been awarded

- **5. Parish Action Plan/Projects: Playground** Fault report sent to Kompan October 2021 with 3 areas of concern:
- 1. Rubber matting installed August 2020 by Kompan sub-contractor. 15th October a 14cm hole was noted on a routine inspection under the big swing seat. Action: Kompan to repair
- 2. Tufts of grass around the matting. There is membrane under the matting to prevent grass growth. The tufts are due to air born seeds. Action: PC to arrange removal.
- 3. Several areas around playground rubber matting are starting to give, especially by the roundabout. Action: Cllr Du Plessis to review quote spec and discuss with Kompan.
- 4. Agreed a fault report will be sent to Kompan regarding the slowness of the Zip wire. Action: Cllr Du Plessis

Registry of common Land – The land going up the middle of the High Street is unregistered Common Land with the exception of the allotments. The Parish Council will investigate registering the land under the PC and provide Brett Newman, owner of The Pilgrim, to have easement for the green outside the pub, allowing the pub to continue full use of land in the same way it has done for many years. The conditions of the easement will be agreed once BCC have advised the process through their lawyers. The purpose of registering the land and the easement are to protect the land usage for the pub and village.

Resolved: Cllr Newman to provide a quote in the December meeting

Barn Parish Boundary -

- 1. Noted an anonymous letter was handed to Cllr Gomm in the meeting regarding the piece of land opposite 33 Quainton Road.
- 2. Agreed the ladies who claim to 'own' the land have been asked to produce land documentation to BCC. Agreed by both parties that an independent Land surveyor can define the boundary between the barn and 'the land'. Agreed Cllr Gomm will request the ladies to pay 50\50 for this to be done. On completion the PC will put up a fence asap.

Village pond and Small Village pond – Trevor Jenkins will send a report to Cllr Mordue for the December meeting to discuss the way forward for both ponds. Cllr Mordue also has the speedwatch equipment and documentation from Trevor Jenkins. Speedwatch will be discussed in the December meeting. The parish Council would like to thank Trevor Jenkins for all his invaluable help looking after the 2 ponds in the village, his contribution to Speedwatch and the Neighbourhood Plan as well as all the help he has given the village and wish him well going forward.




