## **COVID-19 Update**

## **Rules from 17th May**

- 1. Outdoors, most social contact rules will be lifted, but gatherings of more than 30 will be illegal
- 2. Indoors, the rule of six or a larger group of up to two households will be allowed
- 3. Indoor hospitality pubs, restaurants, cinemas, theatres, museums, galleries, concert halls, children play areas, hotels, B&Bs, indoor exercise classes will be allowed
- 4. Advice on social distancing between family and friends, including hugging, will be updated no later than 17 May
- 5. Large indoor performances and sporting events with a capacity of 1,000 people will be allowed, supported by testing
- 6. Outdoor large performances and sporting events will have a maximum capacity of 4,000 people or must only be half full, whichever is lower, supported by testing
- 7. Bigger sports stadiums will be allowed 10,000 people or can only be a quarter full, whichever is lower, supported by testing
- 8. Weddings, wedding receptions, wakes, funerals and christenings will be allowed with 30 people

## The truth about fishing

Did you know that the Marine Stewardship Council estimates that 90% of world fish stocks are fully, or over exploited?

→ The fishing industry ranges from village canoes to huge trawlers out to sea. Roughly ½ of all production is industrialised trawling & farming.

## Problems within the fishing industry

## Plastic pollution:

-Discarded nets, lines & ropes now make up about 46% of the Great Pacific Garbage Patch.

#### Extinction:

-Overfishing has led to fish populations declining to near extinction. Could have fishless oceans by 2048.

## Bycatch:

- 40% of all marine life caught is thrown overboard as bycatch (the capture of unwanted sea life).

## Damage to coral reefs:

-90% of coral reef is expected to die by 2050.

## So, what can we do?

## Cut down on fish consumption

- Switch to a plant based diet or...
- Cut down on how much fish you eat; treat fish as a treat

## Be open to different species

- This includes obscure and rare varieties of fish & seafood

## ❖ Find a fishmonger

- Knows where the fish is from & how overfishing + by-catch has been minimised

Make us guardians of your world Make us mindful of others' needs Make us mindful of your steadfast love and care All your people honour your holy name.


All creation offers you, Lord most high Praise and thanksgiving, obedience and worship Forgive, remember and restore your people Majesty, power and glory are yours O Lord.

# Walk of the month May 2021. Created by Val Newby, map by John Spargo

This walk starts as before from the village hall. From there head up the High Street and turn left up Church Street. Stop to admire the village pond which is currently full of lively newts and I am hoping one day some ducks will join them. Carry on past the church into Townsend and then into Marston Fields Road. After a few metres go right into the driveway of 2A (Ref 1) and then left through the wooden gate. At the bottom of the garden pass through a metal kissing gate and turn sharp left along the boundary to a field to a wooden stile. Cross the driveway to a grassy path about 75 metres long. (Note this is not a public right of way, please keep close to the field boundary) This leads to a stile. Go over this and turn left (Ref 2) and go down the field for about 200 metres to a three-barred stile. (Ref 3) Turn left to a kissing gate, over the ditch and half right into the copse. Now cross the field to Marston Fields Road (Ref 4) and carry straight on through the kissing gate opposite and up the slope past Owls Oak Stables, ignoring the footpath that goes to the left. Now pass through another kissing gate and turn left down the field towards the cattle trough. At the gap in the hedge (Ref 5) adjacent to Widows Pond, follow a path which leads back down the hill to the Granborough Road. (Ref 6) Now turn left and walk 100 metres back to the village hall. If you keep walking a further 150 metres up the High Street you can reach The Pilgrim for a well deserved pint!

## **Local Ghost Stories**

Source: The County Book: Buckinghamshire, pp252-253 by Alison Uttley, published in 1950

" A short distance away is lower Hogshaw Farm, which is marked Fulbrook Farm on the map now the village has gone, This good farm, with its haystacks and corn ricks all within old red brick walls all lichened and mossy, is the remnant of the once populous village. The font from Hogshaw Church, is said to be there. The poppy heads from the stalls of the church are at Doddershall manor house on the staircase.

The site of the village is close to the farmhouse, in a meadow called Ram Close. It is traditionally haunted and the ghosts of the dead can be seen by certain people. There is a duck-pond on the field which always has ducks on it according to an old tale. This is one of those odd little legends of bird-hauntings, either wild or tame ducks are there.

We went through this by the grassy track, along Steart Lane and it joins Deadman's Lane.

A countryman told us legends of this place, authentic tales handed down to him by old relations and villagers. His uncle worked for some years at Crandon Farm, and he saw strange happenings in the Hogshaw district. A bright light shone before him, several yards ahead, one pitch-black morning when never a star was out. This occurred in a field known as Dick Tarn. He saw this light on seven different occasions. Others had seen it and they referred to it as the "Old Man with the Lantern" for the light had the clarity and flooding of lantern-light. Nobody was there, nor was any source of light found.

This tale of lantern-light is akin to ghost tales in the north and it has nothing to do with will-o'-the-wisp, which is jack o' the lantern moving, and darting over marshy lands, a natural phenomenon of marsh gas."

#### **Scheduled Service Update**

We are now running our Wednesday Winslow Market Service, and from 16<sup>th</sup> April our Friday & Saturday Aylesbury Market Service.

Due to government restrictions, and the need to keep yourselves and our drivers safe, we have put in place strict guidelines for our drivers and passengers.

To comply with current 1 metre + social distancing, we have removed some seats as we are only able to transport 6 passengers at any one time. It will also be impossible to use the tail lift while maintaining a socially safe distance, so you will need to be able to board the bus unaided using the main door.

We are providing this limited service on the strict understanding that passengers travel entirely at their own risk. While we have made every effort to make the bus as safe as possible to travel in, we ask that all passengers follow the below guidelines:

- Your place on the journey must be pre-booked by calling the WDCB Coordinator on
- 07483 336440
- We will not accept cash on the bus, so any payment must be organised prior to the journey with the WDCB Coordinator
- You must complete a Contact Form prior to the journey and give it to the driver (you will only need to do this for your first journey). This will only be used as part of the track and trace process.
- Face coverings must be worn whilst boarding and travelling on the bus
- Hand sanitiser must be used before boarding the bus and when leaving your seat to exit the bus (sanitiser supplied on the bus)
- You must take the rear-most available seat when boarding the bus
- You must exit the bus one at a time, with the front seats exiting first

Passengers are not to travel on the bus if they or any member of their household are displaying any signs of the COVID-19 virus.

Should you develop COVID-19 symptoms in the days following your journey on the bus, you must let the WDCB Coordinator know.

Our aim is to restart all of our scheduled routes over the coming months.

Excursions and hires remain suspended for the foreseeable future.

## **Granborough Village Hall Needs You**

Granborough village hall is a registered charity run by a group of Trustees who are responsible for maintaining the hall and grounds. The hall is for everyone to use and is hired regularly by many age groups for meetings, classes, parties and other events. The Church use it as a hall and the Parish Council meets there. We should have a minimum of eleven Trustees who include the Vicar, the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Parish Council. We would welcome more residents to join us. The only qualifications required are that you live(ed) in Granborough and have an interest in the future of the village hall. We are approaching exciting times as we plan to re-open a fully restored hall in Summer 2021 with a new calendar of exciting events.

We meet between 6 and 8 times a year and organise several social events during the year. We also support other village events such as the Charter Fayre.

## **Grass cutting on the Sports Field**

At this time of year we begin cutting the outfield and open spaces on the Sports Field. This is done weekly during April, May, June & July. After this the grass growth usually slows down and the frequency of cuts is generally not as regular.

With up to 25 grass cuts during the season (April – September) we try to get as many people as possible to volunteer for one of these cuts. It spreads the load. To cut the whole field takes around 3 hours so it's not unduly time consuming and on a warm summer's day/ evening it can indeed be an enjoyable way to spend a few hours.

We have a ride-on mower which is easy to use and all new volunteers will be given a short demo on how to operate the mowing machine. This can be done beforehand, usually on one evening with a group of others new volunteers.

If you use the Sports Field in any capacity, I'm sure you will appreciate how much effort and goodwill goes into the upkeep. If you would like to contribute to its upkeep this is one way that you can help us. We always find it difficult to fill our mowing rota and often 3 or 4 of the stalwarts end up having to do 2, 3 or 4 grass cuts to fill in the weeks where we are short of volunteers.

We operate a rota for the mowing and this is filled on a weekly basis as volunteers respond. There are 25 weeks to choose from. Some have already been filled but we have many more weeks still to fill.


## North Marston Community Speedwatch Group (NMCSWG): MVAS Vehicle Speed Report

March 2021: Recorded at Quainton Road (coming into the village)

The MVAS (Moveable Vehicle Activated Sign) device is pole-mounted at variable points in the village. MVAS logs data on whicles' speed, date and time coming into the village and flashes up a speed limit reminder to violators travelling faster than 30mph, the legal speed limit in North Marston.

#### Results

- 12868 vehicle passes were recorded;
- 15% of vehicles (15%) were recorded violating the 30mph speed limit;
- · The fastest recorded vehicles (55) were travelling between 40-50mph.
- Speeding increases risks of injury and death to pedestrians, dog walkers, cyclists, riders and their horses and residents' pets, and risk of prosecution

# Public Rights of Way (PRoW): Footpaths and Bridleways: Responsibilities for Maintenance

The Parish Council is not responsible for maintaining footpaths, responsibilities are divided between landowners and Buckinghamshire Council (BC). This is a quick guide, detailed information is at <a href="https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/environment/public-rights-way/">https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/environment/public-rights-way/</a>

Trees and hedges: it is the landowner's responsibility to maintain hedges and trees adjacent to PRoWs. BC has powers to require owners to remove overgrowth (Highway Act 1980 section 154). Undergrowth: BC are responsible for clearing any vegetation naturally growing on the surface of a path, and respond to requests for clearance as required.

There is nothing to prevent walkers from clearing PRoWs and Ramblers Association Path Clearing Groups do so in some areas. Leave the landowners vegetation: it is their property.

Autumn cultivation and PRoWs: Legally, a farmer may plough a PRoW only if it is not convenient to avoid disturbing the path, but must reinstate it within 14 days of first disturbance, and the path must be levelled and made visible, and within 24 hours of any subsequent disturbance. Reinstatement must be: at least 1 metre for a cross-field footpath, across the cultivation; 2 metres for a crossfield bridleway across the cultivations.

Report an issue on a public footpath, bridleway or byway online. <a href="https://prow.buckscc.gov.uk/standardmap.aspx">https://prow.buckscc.gov.uk/standardmap.aspx</a>

Eg: broken stiles; overgrown vegetation or fallen trees; damaged or dangerous path surfaces; damaged or dangerous bridges; damaged or missing signposts and waymarks.

Or, The Ramblers Association: Report path problems through Pathwatch and they will alert the local highway authority. <a href="https://www.ramblers.org.uk/advice/pathwatch-report-path-features-and-problems.aspx">https://www.ramblers.org.uk/advice/pathwatch-report-path-features-and-problems.aspx</a>

The Ramblers have their Pathwatch App you can download and then report problems on your walk as you come across them.






